### Transitional Executive Leader report Gail Doering

On May 7, 2022, at our PSK Stated Meeting, the gathered assembly voted to sell the PSK office building on 3521 W 21st St, in Wichita. It will be a process led by the Trustees, with other groups and of course, staff, providing support and taking on parts of the project.

That is the mechanical side of the sales transaction, but what about the intangible loss? Where do we go from here? How do we maintain history and purpose without a physical landing spot? Someone asked, "If we sell the building, what will be the identity of the Presbytery?"



Perhaps we are in an age where brick and mortar are becoming less and less a key factor in organizational identity. However, for those who purchased, moved in, planned events, and met with friends and colleagues over the years in this very building, the connection between identity and building are real. This is not something to be taken lightly or overlooked. Rest assured, many Presbyteries and Synods across the US have forged this ground before us, and I hope we can continue to learn from them as to how they relinquished as well as re-established an identity.

My hope for us as we walk through the steps is that we will prayerfully give thanks for what has been and dream of God's future of how to move forward, as we
