From Pastor Scott:

Sometimes we pray because of an emergency situation. We hear something on the news or we hear something about a family member and we start to pray immediately. We know what to pray and we pray with ernest. "Lord, help them. Lord, heal them. Lord, protect them and comfort with Your Holy Spirit."

Other times when we pray, we frankly don't know what to pray. Maybe we've decided on a goal to have a daily time of prayer. I remember a number of times planning to pray for a full hour each day and then running out of things to pray for within a few minutes. So I made a list of things to pray for and carried the list with me, adding to it through the days and weeks. However the effort, my prayers still lasted around 10 minutes, because I was out of things to pray for. How do monks and nuns pray for hours a day?

As Christians, the desire to pray comes from within us, as the Holy Spirit prompts us to pray. But there must be more to prayer than S.O.S. type prayers. Prayers in times of emergency are important, but they're not the only way we're to pray.

At some point in our journey with Jesus we come to the place where we say, "Lord, what should I pray?" We've then reached a milestone in our prayer life. It is actually very helpful to ask God what to pray. Why?

Because maybe we don't fully understand the situation or the needs of a person. We want God to respond immediately, but we don't fully know the what or why or how we should pray. So ask, "Jesus, why pray about this?" A conversation has just begun and it will be really fruitful.

We're asking how to pray, what to pray for, and I believe God will answer. And overtime, the feeling of not knowing what to pray or the feeling that "prayer doesn't work" will soon fade. Prayer definitely does work, when we know how to pray.

John says in one of his letters, "This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. And if we know that he hears us — whatever we ask — we know that we have what we asked of him" (1 John 5:14–15).

Amazing! Just as Jesus disciples asked Him how they should pray, saying, "Teach us how to pray." God will show us how to pray and then we're praying effectively. And isn't that we we're wanting to do? We want to pray effectively and see God answer our prayers.

You can begin this conversation by praying for a loved one. You may be praying for them often and now you can begin with, "Lord, what should I pray?" Then listen for confirmation about what you've been praying for, or listen for a new insight in how to pray. You may be praying diligently for a loved one to get a new or better job, but when you ask God, "How should I pray?", He may respond, "Pray for their heart." What an awesome time of prayer this will be with the new way to pray God has given you. Truly, it your prayers will become more effective when you pray according to His will by first asking, "God, what do I pray?"








PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN
