The Bible says God is with us always and is found when we seek Him.


The LORD is with you when you are with him. If you seek him, he will be found by you. (2 Chronicles 15:2)

I will give them a heart to know me, that I am the LORD. They will be my people, and I will be their God, for they will return to me with all their heart. (Jeremiah 24:7)

A vesper is one of St. Benedict's daily "offices" for prayer and turning our attention to God. St. Benedict actually held "offices" all throughout the day and one in the middle of the night.

I'd like to encourage you to write "vesper" in your calendar each day at 4 pm and say a short and simple prayer. Something like, "Jesus, I belong to you". When you do, look around you for a moment, look for something beautiful to thank God for. Maybe a picture of a Kansas sunset, a photo from a wonderful vacation, or the portrait of someone you love. Maybe you can plan to be somewhere beautiful when your calendar alarm reminds you of this short "vesper".

As you make your summer plans, plan some refreshing times with Jesus.


